#### College testing info & updates as of now

If you haven't taken the SAT/ACT and want to, remember to register.
 This is done separate from counseling, we have no ability to register you for SAT/ ACT. You do this on the College Board or ACT website.

 Some schools are **test optional**, which means schools will consider SAT or ACT test scores if they are submitted, but will only consider other factors if the score is not submitted.

 Occasionally schools are test blind, which means that do not consider scores at all in the admissions process.



#### **Transcripts**



- Juniors will receive a copy of their transcript from their counselor when they meet for academic advising
- You can also review all of your grades in StudentVue→Course History
- If you retook a class at any point during high school, the original class and grade remains on the transcript, but GPA is recalculated
- If you want middle school grades removed from your transcript, you must do that before summer break
  - Counselors cannot calculate hypothetical GPAs!
- Your transcript will have your official SAT/ACT scores on it. You can remove them with the form found on our website

#### **Recommendation Letters**



- Many colleges require a counselor letter of recommendation and/or a teacher recommendation
- Insight Sheets are required in order for your counselor to write a recommendation letter- submit to your counselor via email or share as a google document by the end of the school year!
- Parents can also complete an insight sheet.
- Students should consider asking two teachers they want to ask for a recommendation from and make that request before the summer. Please complete the classroom insight sheet for teachers.

#### Where can I find the Counseling Forms?



- YHS academic planning form— This document can be used in yearly planning with your student. Counselor may use this, the graduation checklist \ or the Naviance Planner in their conversations
- Graduation Checklist- use this form to confirm you have credits you need to graduate, or you're at least well on your way!

#### Senior Forms:

The Insight \* forms will be used as a tool see what is not evident to the average person, it stresses accuracy and goes beyond what is svious or superficiely

- Parent Insight Form \*(Fillable Word Doc) or PDF Parents are strongly encouraged to fill out and return this form to their student's counselor via email. Loing so assists the counselor in writing a stronger recommendation letter with a more personalized tone. You will need to email this form to your student's counselor before recommendations are requested.
- <u>Student Insight Form</u> \*(Fillable Word Doc), <u>Google Doc</u> or <u>PDF</u> Students are required to fill out and turn in this form to their counselor to have a recommendation letter written for colleges. Information will assist them in highlighting your extracurricular activities, interests and career goals to complete your college application. Students need to email this form to their counselor when they request a recommendation letter. (Students only can access google doc when logged into their browser with APS Logil)
- Classroom Insight Form \*(Fillable Word Doc) or PDF Use this form after speaking directly to the teacher who has agreed
  to write your recommendation. Fill it out and send it to the teacher completing the recommendation. Then, add teacher
  re wests into your Navis ace Account.
- · REQUEST recommendation letter & Transcript for college applications from Counseling
- Transcript Requests for FORMER students; obtain their transcript through Parchment for a small fee.
- Activities Sheet- YHS students out use this sample to create their own.
- <u>Elimination of Middle School Grades Form</u> this form is due by June 15 of Junior year.

- ☐ Prepare and Register for SAT/ACT if you plan to take it
- Complete your counselor insight form and share with your counselor by the end of the school year
- □ Speak with teachers for recommendations and complete the "Classroom Insight Form"
- Submit form to remove middle school grades by June 1st.
- Complete the form to remove your SAT/ACT scores from your transcript if you don't want it displayed
- Next week, students will review this information with counselors and receive a copy of the junior checklist, middle school grade removal form, and SAT/ACT score removal form
